Kids of Our Heroes Adventure Camp

Let's go to the Kids of Our Heroes Adventure Camp! We will go out in the country south of Aurora, Mo., to a little community known as Jenkins. The road becomes dirt and narrows as it winds its way to a valley, crosses a bridge, turns left and in less than a mile takes you there. It's primitive but very welcoming. As you walk toward an open air pavilion/dining facility, you pass by a fire pit. To the south is a field with a flag pole and Old Glory waving in the breeze. To the north you over-look beautiful Flat Creek. Visitors cross in a vehicle to the other side. There you see another fire pit surrounded by swings. Beyond that is the counselors cabin then four tents, each with capacity of five. Solar showers and bathrooms are not too far away. Campers cross a 173foot suspended foot-bridge over the creek. Kids, age 11-17, find courage, resiliancy and confidence here. The week is structured and everything has a purpose; daily theme, scripture, song, coping skill and activity. At night, kids will gather around the fire pit, be given a stick that they will catch on fire. They will then go to the creek, put the fire out, return to the fire pit and try to rekindle it. Wet wood will take longer to ignite and the counselor is meanwhile teaching. Their attention is captivated. The "stick-fire-water" lesson: dousing the fire of fears, anxieties, insecurities, sorrows, and anguish by the daily healing experience of the camp makes those fires harder to ignite in their lives.

This camp is free to the kids of wounded, fallen (or committed suicide) warriors and first responders. Donations are used for compensation for cook and counselors, food, supplies, electricity and upkeep of the camp. Donate and help the kids


The third quarterly District 17 meeting was held in March and hosted by Post 138 Legionnaires and Unit Auxiliary members

Also attending the event was Cathie Goth, Department VA&R Chairman, and her husband, Kenneth.


CREATIVE ARTS PROGRAM
