Washington Conference 2024 Claudia Goodin

I have just returned from the Annual American Legion Washington DC Conference. Monday. I attended the Legislative Commission session at the Conference. We were presented with a new American Legion Legislative Agenda. Tuesday and Wednesday the Missouri delegation visited both senators' offices and various other representatives. We presented The American Legion Legislative Agenda for the 118th Congress. 2nd Session and it is as follows as follows:

Suicide Prevention & Mental Health – PFC Joseph P. Dwyer Peer Support Program (H.R. 2768) and VA Zero Suicide Demonstration Act (H.R. 1639)

Alternative Treatments - TBI and PTSD Treatment Act (H.R. 105)

VA Health Modernization - The Department of Veterans Affairs Electronic Health Record Modernization Improvement Act (H.R. 592)

Pact Act: Implementation & Oversight – The American legion urges Congress to provide the necessary oversight and funding to ensure VA has resources to properly implement this legislation.

Safeguard Veterans Benefits - Veterans Benefits Improvement Act (H.R. 1530)

Concurrent Receipt - The Richard Star Act (H.R. 1282)

Guard & Reserve GI Bill Parity – The American Legion believes that every day in uniform counts and urges Congress to recognize the service of Guard and Reserve servicemembers as eligible for the GI Bill.

GI Bill for Honorable Service – The American legion urges congress to correct this statutory incongruity by amending U.S. Code to allow access to VA educational assistance to veterans with general under honorable conditions discharges.

Military Quality of Life - Military Housing Readiness Council Act (H.R. S.2047) Pay the Coast Guard - Pay our Coast Guard Parity Act (H.R. 2693)

Access to healthcare of overseas military and families – Health Care Fairness for Military Families Act (H.R. 1045)

Improving the military TAP (Transition Assistance Program) – VET-TEC Authorization Act of 2023 (H.R. 669)

Protect the American Flag – The American Legion urges Congress to approve an amendment to the U.S. Constitution that would allow Congress to prohibit the physical desecration of the US Flag. Senate Joint Resolution 34)

How it works: When it get closer to the start of the auction, another flyer will be sent out with the website you can access to bid on auction items along with instructions. At convention there will be laptops set up so that you can still check your bid, or for those that do not have the capability to go online.

A Family Mystery Solved - 21 Years Later! - SGT Gerald W. Zdarsky -WWII Army Air Force Tori Vernau

I'm well aware that I nag veterans about several things: recording their stories, making arrangements, letting loved ones know what they want when they leave us, and this story in my own family may be one of those.....or it may be a case of a wife who just didn't care to deal with things in her grief. But it ends well, I promise.

Late last year, I found, in talking with my cousin, that my beloved uncle, a decorated WWII veteran, was not buried in a national cemetery, nor a private one either. She shared that unbeknownst to her at the time, her mother decided to have him cremated and scattered by the funeral home - and that was that.

I was devastated, as I had plans to order a wreath for his grave if he was in a national cemetery, and wanted to honor his memory. But of course it's more than that, and it was hard to believe that the honor he could have had, at no cost to her, was lost. I even drafted a note about how to order a memorial marker and almost sent it to her. His death was in 2002 when I was not invited to the visitation or funeral (there weren't any), and the event passed by as if it never happened.

Earlier this month, my cousin texted me a picture of his marker, wondering who had ordered it.....it is in Bath National Cemetery, New York (near where they lived in Buffalo), and all the information on it is correct. I look at it and can't find anything that indicates that it is a memorial marker, so I say well, if this marker were at Jefferson Barracks, HE would be there too. So of course I called the next morning and indeed, my uncle, through no effort of his family, has a place in a National Cemetery, per his own wishes! Why?

Well, the cemetery explained that my uncle had been buried with 11 other indigent/unclaimed veterans from a funeral home 10 years after his death. He is listed as "unmarried at the time of his death". Just as our state does and the VA supports, New York State has a program to inter those veterans who are "stuck" in funeral homes as "unclaimed". Apparently, my aunt had only verbally instructed the funeral home what to do, and like anything else, that didn't happen because the paperwork wasn't done. At least, that's our best guess, since my aunt is no longer with us to tell us what really happened.

I then contacted the New York Patriot Guard, just to see if maybe, just maybe, they could come up with any pictures. They did, 142 of them! If you've never gotten to go to a ceremony for these veterans, the picture of my uncle's is here, from 2012. And, they tracked down the flag as well, which will make its way out to my cousin in California to be presented to his daughter by the California Patriot Guard. At last, after almost 22 years, her family will have the closure that some of us take for granted. You can bet that they will not.

I've been working on a couple of other things to honor his military accomplishments - which might be fodder for another article! But for now, it sure is nice to know that a SGT that earned the Distinguished Flying Cross and 3 Air Medals, rests in peace with his comrades at a National Cemetery. It's already a Fabulous 2024.
