Children & Youth

The Children & Youth program emphasizes children and youth, especially of veterans and military families.

There are several ways to promote the program in your community. Monitor newspapers, TV, and neighborhoods for children and youth who have performed a heroic act of physical valor such as performing CPR, helping evacuate in the event of a fire, calling 9-1-1 for an emergency in their home or elsewhere, etc. Nominate the child for a Youth Hero/Good Deed Award. The form can be printed from the National site. The form is then sent to the Department Secretary so it can be forwarded to National.

Be sure to get pictures, and share with your local newspaper.

Contact your local churches, homeless shelters, and food pantries identify homeless veterans children. Ask about their needs and what the American Legion Auxiliary can do to help them. You may also contact local schools to assess their need for supplies and extra clothes. Your local service officer is a good resource.

Local Auxiliary food pantries are a good source for helping homeless and underprivileged children. Make things to help the special needs of the children. One thing that is special to a child is gifts at Christmas and on a birthday. Stock the food pantry with small toys for boys and girls so they may choose a special gift for themselves.

Packaged items for a birthday party can also be on the shelves. Perhaps it can include a cake mix, frosting, candles, napkins, plates, flatware, and favors for a party.

Mid-year reports reflect the program work of your unit and district. Please submit a narrative to the District chairman so she can compile and send it to me by December 15, 2021. Include the number of volunteers and all the programs from the units. April is Children & Youth month, so there should be many activities to include on the end-of-year report. A best unit and district narrative report will be awarded at Department Convention in July.

Poppy Poster Contest Rules

Units shall sponsor contests in local schools. When schools do not conduct activities, other youth groups, including Junior members, may participate under direct supervision of the unit.

Contest Classes

Class I: Grades 2 and 3

Class II: Grades 4 and 5

Class III: Grades 6 and 7 Class IV: Grades 8 and 9

Class V: Grades 10 and 11

Class VI: Grade 12

Class VII: Students with special needs defined as: a. Those in special education classes.

b. A student recommended for special education classes but who has not been admitted due to a waiting list or various other factors.

c. A child identified as having a disability but not in a special education class due to lack of facilities; identification contingent upon discretion of school official

Poppy Poster Requirements

Each poster shall have a fitting slogan not to exceed 10 words. Articles "a," "and," "an," "the" are not to be counted as words. The words "buddy" and "buy" cannot be used.

2. The words "American Legion Auxiliary" must be used in the design of the poster and will not be counted in the 10-word count.

3. Each poster must include a picture of the red Flanders Field poppy.

4. The department shall determine the closing date of the unit contest. The poster shall be on 11x14" poster board. (Drawing paper will not be accepted.)

The United States flag may be used as long as there are no infractions of the flag code.

6. Posters will be judged using the following criteria: 50% - poster appeal (layout, message, originality)

40% - artistic ability (design and color)

10% - neatness

7. Media used shall be watercolors, crayons, powder or oil paint, handmade paper cutouts, ink or textures, acrylics, pencils, and markers.

Written in ink on the back of the poster (not attached) shall be the class in which the entry is submitted, the name, address, age and grade of the contestant and the name of the department. Please include District and Unit.

9. Submissions become property of the American Legion Auxiliary. Through submission of artwork, contestants and their legal guardians grant nonexclusive reproduction and publication rights to the works submitted and agree to have their names and artwork published for commercial use without additional compensation or permission.

10. The poster shall be the work of only one individual.

11. The label "In Memoriam" from the veteran-made poppy may not be used

Poppy Poster Contest Judging and Awards

1. Each department shall establish its own procedure for judging

2. A citation will be given for the most outstanding poster in each classification within the five divisions

3. Unit members should follow deadlines and process for the department. All department entries are due to the division chairman by June 1.

4. Although ALA representatives will do their best to return all posters, it is not guaranteed. We recommend participants take a picture or scan their poster for their records.

Submissions become property of the American Legion Auxiliary. Through submission of artwork, contestants and their legal guardians grant nonexclusive reproduction and $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right$ publication rights to the works submitted and agree to have their names and artwork published for commercial use without additional compensation or permission

LEGISLATIVE

The Legislative program provides information and assistance to the American Legion Auxiliary members to advocate for the Legislative agenda of the American Legion.

Encourage and empower members to be more knowledgeable to act on the American Legion's legislative priorities. I have distributed information sheets listing the websites for the U.S. Senate and the House of Representatives and for Missouri's state legislators. You can look up your legislators and contact them on the Legion's priorities by email or by phone or in person. I also have listed information to sign up for Legislative Action Alerts. The American Legion will let us know when we need to act and contact Congress. Please sign up for the Legion's Legislative Updates. It would be wise to order a copy of the ALA Legislative Advocacy Guide through Department, and this guide may also be downloaded from alaforveterans.org. I would also ask that you "like" the ALA Legislative Facebook page. There is always lots of timely information there....and then "share it." National Legislative Key Updates

S. 544: Buddy Check Week Act of 2021
Bill Status: 10/07/21 Passed Senate without amendment by Unanimous Consent

Co-Sponsors: 21 Staff Notes: Now that S.544 has passed the Senate, it is awaiting action in the House Veterans Affairs Committee. Legion Legislative Staff is communicating with House side committee staff to have S.544 swiftly moved through markup and/or an omnibus end-of-year bill. American Legion Media Relations will do media outreach on this bill. The pressure is now on the House of Representatives to pass the senate bill and send to the President's desk for signature.

Why it matters: Passing Buddy Check Week Legislation has been a top priority of The American Legion since legislation was first drafted by Senator Ernst in 2020. The bill would direct the Department of Veterans Affairs to designate one week per year as "Buddy Check Week" to organize outreach events and educate veterans on how to conduct peer wellness checks. "Buddy Check Week" bill is modeled off a successful American Legion program to encourage peer wellness checks for veterans.

S. 1040: VA Access for WWII Veterans

Bill Status: Committee on Veterans' Affairs ordered to be reported without amendment favorably

Staff Notes: On June 23 it was the subject of a SVAC Full Committee Hearing where it received VA support. On July 28 it was ordered to be reported favorably without amendment during an SVAC Full Committee Markup. It is now awaiting scheduling for a vote on the Senate Floor. This month, NLD staff sent a letter to Majority Leader Chuck Schumer and Minority Leader Mitch McConnell requesting S.1040 be expeditiously scheduled on the Senate Floor for a vote.

On the State Level - Action needs to be taken to make sure there is a guaranteed funding stream for our Missouri Veteran Homes and Cemeteries. The Missouri Veterans Commission gains its revenue through the gambling boat casinos and through taxes on medical marijuana. As revenues from gaming continue to decline, it is imperative for the state to ensure that the veterans commission funding remains a top priority through maintenance of existing revenue sources with the inclusion of General Revenue to make up for the fiscal shortfalls. What do I need you to do? Contact your MO legislators and ask that they make up any shortfalls in funding to the Missouri Veterans Commission Legislative - Claudia Goodin Chairman

History was one of my favorite subjects in school and is still my favorite one to teach. It is important that we keep an accurate account of our history to pass along to our future generations. They can use history to reflect on the past, to continue things that went well, and change the things that didn't work.

The history of the American Legion Auxiliary began in November 1919 and continues with us today. Our history, like any other history is more than names and dates. It is about our membership and how it developed the ALA's programs and projects to fulfill our mission of serving veterans, service members, and their families, who sacrifice so much for this country.

A written history can tell so much. When an organization's history is told through the eyes of its membership, everyone learns a great deal more about who we are, what we do, and why we matter.

The heart of any organization's history is in its records, items that office rulers, members, directors, staff, and volunteers have produced and compiled over the years. They provide unique testimony to the achievements of an organization. Records also contribute in other ways:

- Members are able to look back and learn what efforts were successful, or unsuccessful, and why.
- materials stimulates and encourages members to maintain the organization's standards and promote its future.
- Maintaining and preserving our records are invaluable to society by serving as informative and educational resources to a variety of potential users.

A major change this year is no request for a mid-year report. Instead, districts and units are required to share the story and photos of their events as they happen. When details are fresh in our minds, it is much easier to present a clear picture of the event.

There will be a Unit and District history book competition at convention. Each District received the rules. They are also printed in the Legionette. If you are submitting a book for competition, you MUST

- 2. Text: Use 12 point font, Times New Roman or Arial style font
- 3. Paragraphs may be indented or in block form.
- 4. Spacing
 - a. The introduction section is single-spaced. The Unit/District information and the other content is double-spaced
- - a. The introduction section is centered on the page.
 - b. The remaining material should have consistent margins throughout.
 - c. Page numbers are only on the narrative of your History.
 - d. Index is optional and is to be placed in the back of the book

IV. Content (70 scoring points)

The ALA Missouri Unit/District annual history shall be written as a factual narrative beginning with the Installation of Officers for the current year and ending with the summary of end-of-year reports and closing events for this year

- The History shall be written in third person.
- 2. Use clear, concise language with correct spelling
- 3. Do not include computer graphics, pen and ink drawings, illustrations, extra material, newspaper clippings or other embellishments
- 4. You may include pictures placed in your History section only. This is optional. You are not required to use them or penalized for not using them. They should be used only to help tell the story of your Unit/District.
- Make sure that the History tells the story of your Unit/District. It is not about one person. It is about what your Unit/District has done this year
- The typed name/title and written signature of the Unit/District Historian should immediately follow the final paragraph of the history.

Girls State Macae Mickens, Director

As presented at the ALA Department Convention in July, the ALA MGS program encountered many challenges in carrying out the 2021 session. It is important that our program remains as transparent as possible in the costs and planning associated with providing this premier experience for the youth of our state.

After final expenses for the 2021 session were paid, expenses were calculated to determine the cost per delegate in attendance for the This includes payment session. made to the university of Central Missouri for room, board and meals, supplemental expenses to the university such as additional staff meals prior to citizen arrival, as well as the Inaugural banquet, staff attendance cost including rate for staying at UCM, stipend, and background check costs, office expenses, program expenses, plus the annual payment to the ALA Department Office for financial and application work completed for the session. The total rate for these expenses per each of the 465 citizens was calculated to total \$337.66. Remember our current sponsorship cost paid by schools and ALA units per citizen is \$300, leaving the program to pay additional costs of over \$35 per person. This calculation does not include expenses related to furnishing the campaign store, purchasing snacks and apparel for the ALA MGS Shoppe, Activity

Director supplies, attending recruitment opportunities at High School Counselors Conferences, attending National ALA Girls State Leadership Conference, and paying the ALA Girls Nation fee. We feel that these rising costs are a valuable reason to propose a fee increase at the ALA Department Convention in July 2022.

When looking at the cost per delegate expenses, it is clear to the ALA MGS committee that we must continue to evaluate the best opportunities for the future of our program. We have continued to partner with the University of Central Missouri as our host institution, but due to budget constraints and staffing issues, our program has started to see a decline in the services the university is providing the ALA MGS program.

Another area of focus leadership of ALA Missouri Girls State is our continued partnership with The American Legion Boys State program. We continue to evaluate and explore intersections between the TAL MBS and ALA MGS programs to further the mission of both programs and remain the premier civic education and leadership training program in the United States.

Cost, facilities, and partnership have remained a large priority in our further examination of what the 80th session of ALA MGS will look like in June 2022. Because of these decisions, we are unable to provide a finalized session date at this time. We would hope that your ALA units would be able to recruit and provide information on our program occurring during the week of June 12-19 or June 19-25, 2022. We are working to provide you a finalized date as soon as possible, but expect to publicize it during January 2022.

Reminders for our application

The ALA MGS Committee will NOT be handing out or mailing Unit Packets again this year. A copy of the packet will be emailed to all District Presidents and District Girls State Chairs on November 1. All of the District Chairs were emailed on Thursday evening. If you did not receive this, please email director@missourigirlsstate.org. All units can access this packet on our website, www.missourigirlsstate. org on November 1. We are following the same online process. In case you aren't familiar, a female junior who wishes to attend ALA Missouri Girls State will need to enter her information by completing our online application process. Then she will print her completed application, sign it, and return it to the ALA unit or school. The deadline will once again be March 1, 2022, and the fee will remain at \$300 per delegate for the 2022 session. Please read all outlined deadlines in the application material on November 1 and reach out to us with any questions. Each Unit is permitted to send 10 delegates with the possibility of sending additional if vacancies exist.

The ALA MGS Committee has appointed a staff member to serve as a School Recruitment Coordinator to guide school counselors selecting delegates to attend ALA MGS 2022. The Director has provided information to the District Chairs about this process. This position is not replacing the unit's role communicating with area high

schools but providing another opportunity to help connect school representatives with ALA units or sponsorship assistance. units will continue to direct their questions to Mrs. Linda Schaap, ALA MGS dean of admissions.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THE VETERANS AFFAIRS & REHABILITATION COMMITTEE?

The purpose of the VA & R Committee is to promote programs and services that assist and enhance the lives of veterans and their families, ensuring restoration and/or transition to normally functioning lives.

Since caring for our veterans is the core of the American Legion Auxiliary mission, what can you, as a member, do to ensure that the VA & R Program has the volunteer resources it needs to get the job done? You need to work with your local VAVS reps and/or VAMC (VA Medical Center) reps, Department President and the Chief of Voluntary Services to determine ways you may serve the veteran population inside and outside the VA facilities. You should make sure you receive the proper orientation, communicate with everyone and work together to solve problems to ensure smooth and efficient service to our veterans.

HOW CAN AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY MEMBERS **VOLUNTEER?**

Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation encompasses a wide range of services American Legion Auxiliary Members can provide for our veterans. VA&R governs two categories of ALA volunteers: VAVS volunteers and Service to Veterans volunteers. Although the goal of both programs remains the same, there are many differences in how those goals are reached. The most significant difference between the two programs pertains to where the service takes place and how volunteers are recognized for their service.

- VAVS -Veterans Affairs Voluntary Service supports VA strategic goals by recruiting, supporting, and retaining a knowledgeable, diverse, and engaged supplemental workforce of volunteers to assist management in the delivery of VA health care by improving access to care, assisting with longterm care, improving patient satisfaction and much more. Different types of volunteers make up the VAVS. As a VAVS volunteer, opportunities exist at Veterans Affairs medical centers (VAMCs) across the country. Volunteers participate in everything from greeting service members, veterans, and their families as they enter VAMCs to assisting VAMC staff with administrative duties. Volunteers will be placed in different positions depending on need
- Service to Veterans: Service hours can be earned through work done on behalf of veterans in state- or community-based nursing homes/ soldiers homes, contracted veterans homes, day care centers, foster homes, halfway houses, hospices, homeless shelters, Christmas Gift Shops (not at a VAMC), veteran cemeteries or gravesites for any service tasks including but not limited to transportation, snow removal, landscaping/yard mowing, and assisting with tax preparation. Service to Veterans has been designed to give members a chance to volunteer in their communities without the structure of

Hours can also be earned through work done in your home for the benefit of homebound, sick or injured service members and veterans. These activities might include sewing, mending, and/or babysitting while the veteran attends medical appointments or rehab sessions, or making quilts or knitting for hospitalized or homeless veterans. Anything done directly for a veteran outside of a VAMC is considered Service to Veterans.

Providing these services to a member of the volunteer's family or a relative

ALA Junior members may also earn hours through services provided while under supervision of a senior volunteer (examples: reading, playing board games, planning activities around special holidays, and upkeep of veteran gravesites). Volunteers who are not members of the ALA may also receive hour bars as long as their volunteer hours are included in their local unit's impact numbers for the year. These hours may be cumulative over the years, therefore resulting in higher increments of hour bars awarded. A Service to Veterans volunteer will be responsible for recording service hours along with other information if they would like the hours of service recognized. More information is available at alaforveterans.org.

Women Veterans

From the battlefields of the American Revolution to the deserts of Kuwait and Afghanistan, women have been serving in the military in one form or another for more than 200 years. They have had to overcome decades of obstacles to get where they are today. Currently they serve in combat roles and in leadership positions around the world.

In 1948, Congress passed the Women's Armed Services Act. This allowed women to serve as full, permanent members of all branches

of the Armed Forces.

During WWI, 12,000 women served in the rank of yeomen in the Navy. The "yeomanettes" worked in clerical duties, as telephone and radio operators. Today over 52,400 women are serving in active duty in

the Navy.
The 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion was the only African American WAC unit to serve

overseas during WWII. More that 40,000 women were deployed during the Gulf War in 1990 and 1991. 300,000 women served in Iraq and Afghanistan since September 11, 2001. More than 9,000 have earned Combat Action Badges.

In 2020, there were 2 million women veterans in the United States. Our Veteran population is more than 10% female.

During this year I hope everyone will do something special to recognize our Women Veterans. Suggested activities are paying the first-year membership dues into the ALA, highlighting the service of a woman veteran at your meetings, hosting a dinner for them where they can tell about their years of service, and remembering women veterans who are in care facilities with a card, or add your ideas.
