Dear members, summer has arrived and with it a wave of joy as we begin the relaxing months filled with vacations and time with family. It is important to remember that even though reports were due on May 1st, the membership year is not over until the end of August. We encourage you to continue looking for new membership and fostering relationships with existing relationships members.

The latest report from National indicated Units across Missouri have 1,200 UNPAID members.

This means over 13% of our members have not renewed for this year. This many non-renewals affects all levels of our organization. This is a domino effect financially with a reduction of income to the Unit, District, Department and National. For the Department of Missouri alone these non-renewals reduce our Department income Emergency Fund (AEF). During by over \$13,000.00 this year and presents huge problems when trying to balance a budget. Those Units that have several members who have not paid dues will be affected as well. We need all Units to review their non-renewed member lists and make phone calls or personal visits in an attempt to collect dues from these members. The article in the last Legionette listed the main reason people do not renew their membership is they have not felt the value of their membership or they have not felt like their membership was important to the Unit. Units, you work hard to find and sign up new members but you need to work just as hard to renew the members you already had by making them feel like they are an important member of your Unit. Remember there is still time to make that personal contact to renew these members.

Mindi Rue, Central Division Membership Chairman compiled the following list of suggestions for opportunities to talk about American Legion Auxiliary Membership. Look over the fun suggestions for June, July and August; pick one or two and organize a fun event for your American Legion Family, Make sure you invite those members who have not paid their dues for this year; or better yet invite them to help you plan the event which would make them feel valued and needed in your

Remember one of our "Keys to Success" is membership so let's work diligently to reach out to those unpaid members. Another "Key to Success" is Juniors, please don't lose the membership of those Junior Members that are not being paid by "Grandma" anymore. Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation offers two ways that American Legion Auxiliary members can provide services to our veterans: either as VAVS volunteers in VA facilities or as Service to Veterans volunteers in your communities. If you have never volunteered, please consider volunteering sometime in the coming year. Hours for Service to Veterans can be earned by doing anything directly for a veteran outside of a VAMC like sewing, landscaping, babysitting or making quilts.

The following is a good reminder of some ways you can volunteer. It is taken from the Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation: A Guide for Volunteers pamphlet:

Service to Veterans Volunteer Opportunities

After a member has completed their orientation or has made the decision to volunteer outside of a VAMC, the first step should be to identify a service member, veteran, and/or family member's needs within the community. Consider the following when trying to locate where to identify these needs:

· Start with your own post home. Some Legionnaires are now aged, infirmed, confined due to illness or inability to drive, and spend most of their time at home or in assisted living facilities.

· Utilize leaders in your community. Contact government officials, religious leaders, and social service offices to ask about different programs in the community serving Once you have obtained contact

information, reach out to the various organizations and ask them to

- Treat veterans to tickets for sporting events or movies.
- Transitional housing programs have many needs. Secure donations for staple items such as laundry soap, cleaning supplies, kitchen items, new undergarments, etc.
- · Donate a membership to The
- American Legion. · Arrange an outing to a Legion meeting for special events such as a Veterans Day dinner, memorial ser-
- vice, etc. - Furnish a room in transitional housing programs as a special project.
- · Help furnish new living space for a veteran graduating from a transitional housing program. This might include the veteran and his her family. School supplies for children or meals might be extra touch-




